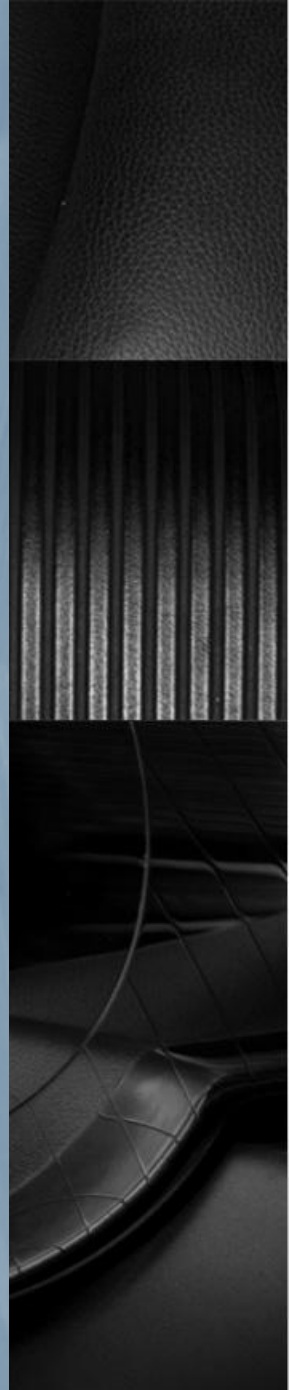

- The 2013 legislative session saw many important policy reforms and investments in education.
- **\$133.9** million to fully fund optional, free, all-day, every-day kindergarten. Beginning 2014-2015 Minnesota's kindergartners will be able to enroll in a free, optional, all-day, every-day kindergarten

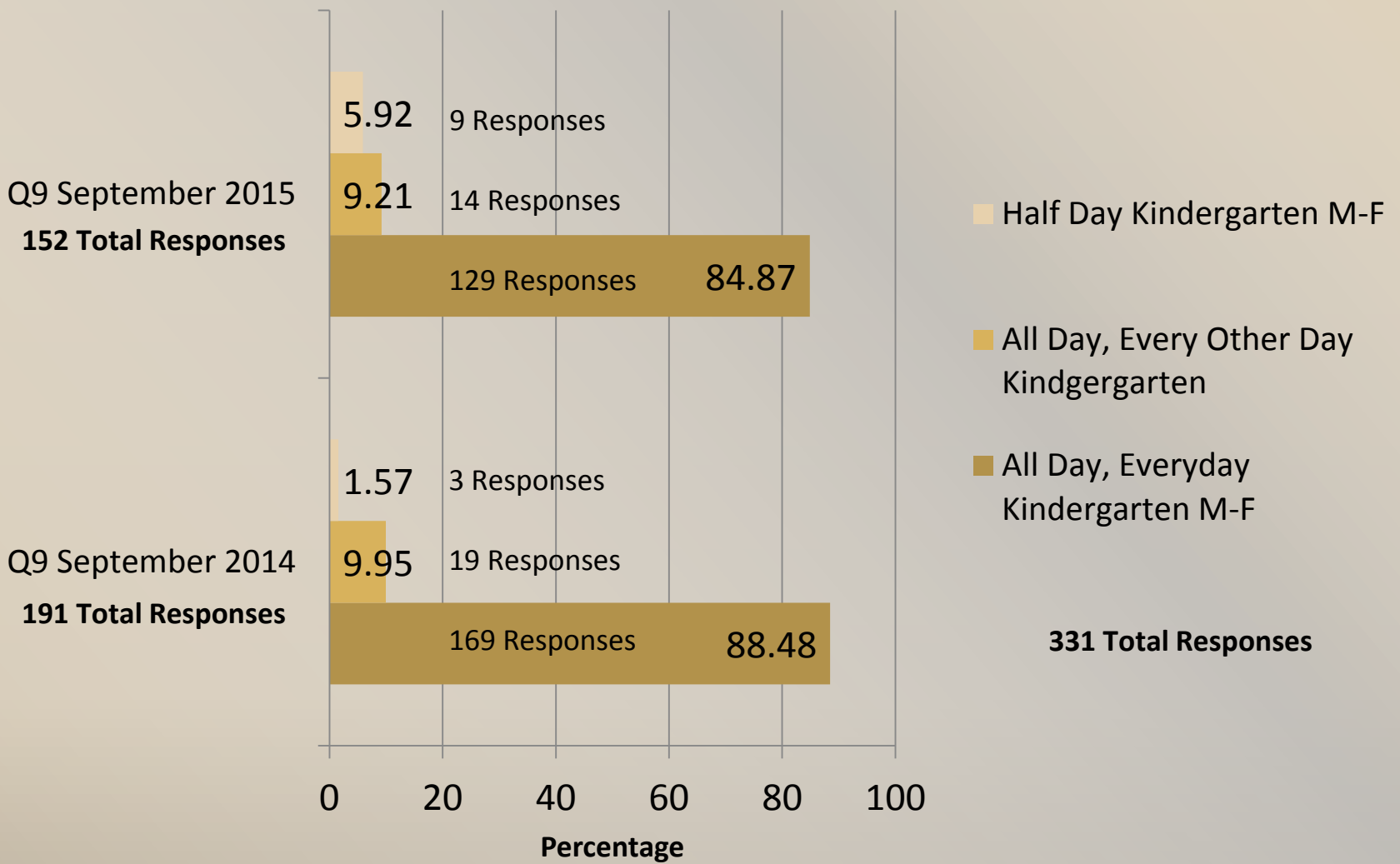
Questions from the Survey:
